
Preschool News


Receiving through Giving

Looking ahead...

Before the year 2000 and before Pastor Fabry retired in 1994 and I was called to be your Senior Pastor, our congregation began a planning process called "Blueprint for 2000". Leaders and members in those years were surveyed as to our needs, feelings, hopes and dreams. The information was collected and then a cross-section of our membership... leaders and members alike... gathered with one of our district representatives who led us in a retreat in Lansing, MI to discuss and organize a master plan or blueprint for future ministry. Goals and priorities that we desired to accomplish helped us in our endeavor to look ahead, and to offer a realistic picture of what we believed God wanted us to do for His Kingdom in the years to come at Christ the King. The information that was gathered and agreed upon brought unity of purpose

and heart to the congregation. It also proved vital in the process of calling another pastor, because the church could be absolutely clear in expressing to a pastoral candidate what it believed it needed in terms of future leadership. You may remember some of those specific goals at the time. Some were: calling a new Senior Pastor, calling a new Assistant Pastor, reroofing the facility, making our church more handicap accessible, building a larger pipe organ, retrofitting and modernizing our existing facility and adding a new, dedicated space for our growing preschool. With God's help, most of these goals were accomplished with God's mercy and a lot of hard work on everyone's part.

Whether we call it a "Blueprint" or whatever else we may now name it, our congregation once again needs a process by which we can gather as leaders and as a congregation to set some realistic goals for the next 5-10 years. At our Membership Meeting on May 15, 2022, the officers announced to the congregation my intention to retire in June of 2024, which will be in two years. So that we can be very clear as a congregation as to our corporate goals for both church and preschool, it is vital that we initiate a process very soon by which we can do some planning and goal setting. Some of those goals/priorities will most likely be calling a new Senior Pastor, mortgage debt reduction and elimination, the development of new outreach ministries, plans for worship... and certainly much more that will be determined by the congregation and its leaders.

To begin the process, your leaders will soon provide you with a survey with questions designed to measure your feelings about many things, from worship, to outreach and further programming. You will most certainly be asked to list and order priorities that you believe are the most important. A committee will later be established representing a cross-section of our membership. They will collect your responses and will organize the results and present them to you to begin this process. The congregation will most certainly gather to discuss findings with this committee, come to a consensus about our needs, and to create a reasonable blueprint for the next 5 years or so. It will be a most exciting time! In order that due diligence is accomplished in the calling of a new pastor, it is imperative that we first do the hard work of assessing our needs and desires and chart a general course where we believe we can and should go with God's help and the Holy Spirit's guidance. This is in effect what we did in the mid 1990's for "Blueprint for 2000." This will give everyone a sense of what we need to do, bring about unity of spirit and purpose, and help us be most responsible in our work of calling a new under-shepherd. Our congregation's clarity about where it intends to go will be a great help to any pastor or pastoral candidate who is assessing his own gifts and considering the call to care for Jesus' flock at Christ the King.

There are so many questions that will most likely need to be answered. The same was true in the mid-90's! But God will lead and provide us with the answers as we work and pray. Will we call a pastor with years of experience, or will we call a candidate from the Seminary? Will we move ahead as Christ the King, or is merger with another congregation the better option for us? Will we continue our traditional style of Lutheran Liturgical Worship, or will the congregation opt for a more contemporary style of worship, or will there be a combination of both styles? Does our congregation even have the resources and/or the gifts to support a different style of worship? Can those resources be readily obtained? All of these things need to be committed to prayer, sober thought and much discussion.

As your current Pastor, I will honestly give any assistance I can to the leaders and to you in the early stages of this process, just as Pastor Fabry did during "Blueprint for 2000." I will be happy to share what I believe is both possible and necessary based upon my experience and my understanding of our congregation. In the later stages of the process when I grow closer retirement and the Divine Call is issued, I will step back unless needed, and retain my personal feelings so that the desires and choices of the congregation will be accomplished objectively and without bias.

The survey will most likely come to you later this summer or early this Fall (2022). The initial committee that gathers to receive your input will most likely begin their work in October or November of this year, and I would assume meetings


with the congregation to discuss planning will begin early in 2023. Finishing the new “blueprint” by the end of the first quarter of 2023, it will be time for the chairman of the congregation to assemble a Pastoral call committee and begin working with Pastor Brad Scott, our Circuit Counselor, and with The Rev. Jamison Hardy our District President. Listening to our needs and to the results of our corporate goal-setting activities, the District will provide a list of suitable candidates for our Divine Call, or the congregation will submit forms to the district president for the calling of a pastoral candidate directly from the Seminary. The congregation should be ready to extend a Divine Call sometime early in 2024. As there are more vacancies in our Synod at this time than pastoral candidates, we will need to work hard and stay close to a timeline, with the prayer that a new pastor could be in place here in early June 2024. One interesting note about the history of Christ the King, we are one of the few congregations that have never experienced a pastoral vacancy! Highly unusual! What is outlined here would be the most desirable timeline for the congregation as well as for me. I have shared with the leaders that while mid-June 2024 is my retirement date, I will do what I can to ensure that you will be served should there be a month or two overlap in the installation of a new pastor.

In laying this now before you, I want you to understand that your Vestry and Board of Elders have already been working together with me discussing various plans for well over a year. Your leaders are being most diligent in their work and will be setting a schedule that will get the needed work accomplished for the welfare of this church that we love so much. Two years still represents a good amount of time for us to work together as Pastor and people, and it is my endeavor to continue to serve you and to provide responsible leadership for you and for our officers as we work toward the future. By reading this, you can see that we have a lot of work to do, but God is with us, and He knows exactly what we need as an 80-year-old congregation centered in Christ. I look forward to our remaining time together, and to all that God has in store...not only for us as a congregation, but for me as well in the Autumn of my ministry with you.

You will be hearing more from our President Ed Fleck, as well as from the CtK Vestry.

Relying on the Holy Spirit

In our spiritual journeys, it is important that we understand two words that pertain to our salvation: justification and sanctification. Most of us can readily offer a good explanation of justification because as Christians we understand that we are saved by grace through faith in Jesus, Who came to live among us and atoned for our sins on the Cross. We are declared righteous because Jesus' righteousness is imputed to us. The Apostle Paul wrote, “But now the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law, although the Law and the Prophets bear witness to it—the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction: for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God and are justified by His grace as a gift through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, Whom God put forward as a propitiation by His blood, to be received by faith. This was to show God's righteousness, because in His divine forbearance He had passed over former sins.” (Romans 3:21-25). Placing our faith in Jesus frees us from the penalty of sin and death. We are given new birth in Jesus.

After being justified, our lives take on a new purpose and direction. We are now walking with the Lord. We are forgiven from the penalty of sin, and we have the Holy Spirit dwells within us and empowers us to live lives that are more Christ-like. Living lives led by the Holy Spirit is a process known as sanctification. Filled with the Holy Spirit, we are no longer

slaves to sin. Sanctification continues during our lifetimes. Sin will never be avoided, but we belong to Jesus so we will sin less. Our lives are committed to pleasing Him and doing His will. We use our time, talents, and money in ways that give our Lord honor and glory. Prompted by the Holy Spirit, we spend time in reading and studying God's Word, praying, and attending worship services and receiving communion.

As we grow and mature in our faith, our lives change from self-indulgent living to lives that are obedient to God with reliance on the Holy Spirit. Filled with the Holy Spirit, we begin to exude what Paul refers to as the fruit of the spirit, which is "love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control." (Galatians 5:22). The fruit of the spirit gives evidence to our spiritual growth and maturity. As we grow in holiness through the sanctification process, we begin to become more like Jesus, but we will never be made fully holy until we are with Jesus in heaven. May God empower all of us to stop relying on our own strength and power and place on reliance on the Holy Spirit.

On Sunday June 5, a presentation was made to our congregation about a special endeavor by which we will celebrate our 80th Anniversary as a congregation, which was actually in 2021, but postponed because of the pandemic. Basically, we are asking each member to give a one-time gift of \$ 80.00 (or more) above and beyond our regular offerings by the end of the year to help us reduce the mortgage debt. Our bank note currently has a balance of \$ 355,000.00. It is our endeavor as a congregation to reduce our debt by at least 8% which would be by approximately \$ 29,000.00. You will be receiving a special letter about this endeavor very soon. One of our members has given a challenge gift to kick start this endeavor at the occasion of our anniversary. We hope you will carefully read the letter and respond as you are able. Our entire purpose for this offering is to reduce our debt, and to work toward the elimination of that debt before the interest rate on our loan will rise in 2024. We also hope to reduce this debt to as little as possible so that the congregation and our next pastor will have more resources to work with for outreach ministry. Let's make this endeavor a success, in thanksgiving to God for 80 years of grace and blessing at Christ the King. When you think that God has helped us reduce our debt from the \$ 1.3 million dollar bank note that we had to incur 19 years ago to \$355,000.00 at this time, God's provision and blessing have been incredible! Rarely has the leadership at Christ the King asked for gifts above/beyond or normal weekly giving. This time we are doing so, to create a blessed future as we look ahead to the changes that will be transpiring in the next two years. Please join us in making this goal a reality! We will celebrate our 80th Anniversary with a special outdoor worship service and barbeque after Labor Day on Sunday, September 11th. Gifts given for "80 for 80" will be collected to the end of 2022. ALL monies given will be applied to mortgage debt reduction.

Sunrise Assisted Living Worship - continues each and every 1st and 3rd Thursday of the month for our friends at Sunrise on Aline/Mack. Services are 20 minutes in length and provide a blessed fellowship in the Gospel for those who live in the memory care unit at Sunrise. We continue to pray the Litany each 2nd and 4th Saturday of each month at 9:30. Join us as we bring our prayers for our people to God and prepare our hearts for Divine Service on Sunday.

Please - be faithful in the giving of your offerings during the summer months. Our worship, educational, fellowship, pastoral care and counseling ministries continue each and every day. Your offerings continue the ministry of Jesus in this place and help us to meet our obligations in a timely way.
